

RANGE HANDICAP ACCESS POLICY FOR MATCHES

WMA members displaying a valid state handicap tag in their windshield will be allowed access to the shooting stations up to 10 minutes prior to the start of a match to set up equipment necessary to participate in that match. The vehicle MUST then leave the range and returned to the parking lot and park in a designated WMA handicap parking spot. The vehicle will remain in the parking area until completion of the match and the match director announces the match is complete at which time the handicapped member will be allowed to drive their vehicle back to the shooting station to retrieve their equipment. Vehicles are restricted down range (forward of the shooting berm) at any time at matches except for the match director's vehicle (or other designated vehicle) for the purpose of setting up prior to the match. Any activities conducted down range of the shooting stations after the start of a match and under all circumstances (i.e. set up and retrieval of targets) will be conducted by the handicapped member, match director or other match participants only by walking down range under cease fire and safe conditions.

EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATORS (ECI)

In an effort to align our Club with NRA rules, the Club will institute the use of empty chamber indicators (ECI) at all matches and during regular range hours as required by the NRA. The ECI must be of a highly visible color such as yellow or orange, and must extend far enough into the chamber of the weapon to ensure the absence of a cartridge in the chamber once the ECI has been inserted. The flag portion of the ECI must extend far enough from the open action so that it is readily visible to the line staff and other competitors. It will be the Match Chair and Co-Chairs responsibility to enforce this rule at all matches and each competitor is responsible for meeting this requirement. Any participant may be disqualified from a match if they don't comply with the rule.

Members should note that some matches listed here may not be held due to lack of participation, match chairs or other unforeseen circumstances. Member MUST refer back to the current match schedule listed on Google calendar on the club website for the latest club information. Please refer to our match inclement weather policy below.

Round restrictions may apply to certain matches depending on ammo availability and will be discussed by all match participants prior to conducting the match. Match directors will have the deciding vote.

MATCH PROCEDURE QUALIFIERS

All scheduled matches must have at least three (3) participants. In the event that this criteria isn't achieved, the match will be cancelled except in the case of inclement weather (see below). The chair and co-chair will be awarded thirty (30) points if they appear and attendees may shoot a "fun match" and receive five (5) points each. The event will not count towards Club champion points. These matches cannot be rescheduled or shot as makeups.

For any match with less than 5 but at least 3 participants, the match may be held. For One–off matches, all participants get full points towards club champion, the top 3 scorers get certificates, but ONLY the top scorer is available for any award monies.

For multi-event matches, a minimum of 3 shooters is required to keep the event from being cancelled. A match with 3-4 shooters is a legal match and that event date can be shot as a makeup.

In the event of inclement weather or low attendance, the match chair/co-chair must remain 30 minutes past the starting time of the match, before it is postponed (weather) or cancelled (attendance).

Every effort will be made to notify members prior to cancelling a match due to inclement weather when possible but match chairs will NOT be responsible for a member arriving past the 30 minute scheduled start time of a match. A match will NOT be considered official if the match chair or co-chair are not present to officiate the match.

It is the Shooters responsibility to inform the Line Officer of any equipment malfunctions, stoppages or requested changes to the course of fire for an individual Match.

Failure to do so can result in the Shooter being removed from the Match.

<u>Classifications:</u> If there are less than 12 shooters, there will only be first, second, & third place awards.

If there are more than 12 shooters, there will be 3 classes:

Trap: A = 25 - 22 B = 21 - 18 C = 17 - belowPistol: A = 200 - 175 B = 174 - 150 C = 149 - below

Tie Scores

In the event of any tie scores at single matches, a shoot off will be conducted at the time the match is held to determine 1st, 2nd and 3rd place standings for prize money and club champion points. Any ties at any other matches will be determined by total Xs or "look back" scores at the conclusion of the match schedule.

EQUIPMENT DEFINITIONS

Iron Sights: Any non-magnifying sight including red dots and aperture sights unless specifically excluded in the description of a given match (i.e. CF two handed pistol, M1 Garand and M1 Carbine)

Service Rifle Definition:

NRA Rule Section 3.1(c) for High Power Rifles – Revised February 2020 Portions listed below.

- "U.S. Service Rifle 5.56 mm M-16 series
- Must be chambered for the $5.56 \times 45 \text{ mm NATO}$ (.223) cartridge. The gas operating system must be fully operable and adhere to the original M-16 rifle design
- The barrel may be no longer than 20 inches; flash suppressor are not required, but if the barrel has a flash suppressor, it shall not be included in the barrel length measurement.
- Metal or synthetic (polymer) magazines, standard issue or commercial equivalent, with standard service 20 or 30- round box magazine dimensions must be attached during the firing of all courses and in all positions. A 10- round magazine with the extra external dimensions as a standard service 20-round box magazine may be used. A dummy magazine with a ramp for single shot loading may be used if this magazine has the same external dimensions as the standard service 20-round box magazine.
- Alternatively, the rifle may be equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights. Metallic sights, if used, must have an M16 type sight design with the rear sight in the carry handle and the front sight in the standard M-16 location.
- Butt- stocks may vary in length and be either fixed or collapsible. Collapsible or adjustable length stocks may be adjusted during an event, but butt-stocks that allow for other adjustments such as the cheek-piece height or butt-plate location may not be used.
- Only standard A1 or A2 type pistol grips may be used.
- Quad rails or similar hand guards may be used.
- An extended bolt release is permitted.

The rifle may have an optical sight (reflective sights are considered optical sights) with a maximum of 4.5X and a maximum objective lens of 34mm may be used. The centerline of an optical sight shall be no higher than 3.5 inches above the centerline of the bore

Competition Rifle - Definition no longer used

Sporting Rifle – Definition no longer used

Bench Rest – No bench rest where the rear support of the rest is connected to the front support of the rest is allowed. This includes rests like the "Lead Sled" and the "Z" rest. As of Nov. 2024, bench rests with attached front and rear supports are allowed including "Lead Sled" and "Z" rest. Rest may not be attached to bench in any way.

M-1 Garand Ammo – IF NOT using club supplied 30-06 ammo in our M-1 Garand rifles, any damage sustained and repairs required to return the club rifle back to full operating condition as a result of hand loaded or commercial ammo that exceeds pressures or bullet weights specifically designed for use in 70 year old Garands will be at the expense of the shooter. Non corrosive loads should be used.

BACK UP GUN (BUG) Match- 7 & 15 Yds – Slow & Rapid Fire

Firearm: Must be centerfire Semi-Auto or Revolver and fit in a box 6.5" x 4.5" x 1.75" per IDPA rules.

All firearms will be inspected by the Chair or Co-Chair to ensure eligibility before the match to ensure eligibility. If the shooters firearm doesn't fit in the box, they can still shoot the match, but their points do not count for match standings

Equipment: First aid kit, stapler, stopwatch, target A-25 cut into 4 targets

Procedure: Match consists of 4 targets. 2 set at 7 yards (slow & rapid fire) and 2 targets set at 15 yards (slow & rapid fire).

The first target at 7 yards is <u>slow fire</u> - <u>5 shots</u>. This may be kept for score or used as a sighter. The relay is shot a second time for any shooters that elected to use the first target as a sighter.

The second target at 7 yards is <u>rapid fire</u> - <u>5 shots</u>. All firearms are loaded and held at the low ready position. The line officer will call, shooters to the line, ready on the right, ready on the left, fire. Shooters will be given 10 seconds to complete the string and a cease fire command will be given. No sighters are allowed.

The second string will be shot in a similar fashion using the 15 yard target frame, one slow fire and one rapid. No sighters allowed.

STEEL PLATE – 22 LR(Standard Velocity) RIFLE MATCHES

Equipment: 22 LR Bolt Action or Semi-Automatic rifle only with a 10 round magazine. A scope with a reticle is highly recommended but red dots may work. An NRL22 style barricade bag is recommended for shooting off the tank trap and pyramid as well as a bipod for the barrel but the club will provide a basic barricade bag for the tank trap and pyramid and shooting bag for the barrel for those who don't own one.

THE RANGE WILL BE CONSIDERED COLD AT ALL TIMES UNTIL THE SHOOTER IS INSTRUCTED TO APPROACH EACH SHOOTING STATION. SO EYE AND EAR PROTECTION IS REQUIRED AT ALL TIMES ON AND OFF THE FIRING PORTS. ALL RIFLES, UNLESS AT THE FIRING LINE, WILL BE LEFT IN THE RIFLE RACK WITH THE MAGAZINE OUT AND EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATORS INSERTED.

Procedure: Two circular steel plates of various sizes will be hung at each station at 50 yards. Shooters will be allowed 2 minutes to shoot 10 shots from the 3 different standing positions: 1 - tank trap, 2 pyramid and 3 - 55 gallon drum. Shooters will be required to shoot from at least 2 different positions at each station.

When called by the director, the shooter will approach each station with magazine out, ECI inserted and rifle pointed in a safe direction. The course of fire will be reviewed and when ready the shooter will hand the empty chamber indicator to the director, insert the magazine and at the director's instruction the timer will be started. The shooter will be instructed to cease fire after 2 minutes if they haven't already shot their 10 rounds. Shooter will then remove their magazine and the director will hand the ECI back to the shooter to insert and confirm the rifle is safe before leaving the firing line. Time and hits will be recorded prior to leaving each station.

This procedure will be repeated for each shooting station. New shooters are required to show up to observe and receive additional match information prior to approaching the firing line for the first time. Shooters are required to zero their rifle for 50 yards before coming to the match.
